BACKFLOW PROGRAM

Remember fall is the time to get your backflow devices tested if you have outdoor irrigation, fire sprinklers a heating system using a boiler or other devices that require backflow prevention.



It is a State of WA requirement that all backflow devices be tested and verified yearly. This is to protect drinking water systems from contaminated water potentially being 'back flowed' into the distribution system and causing a public health threat. **Annual test results are required to be provided to the District** for our records. IMPROVEMENTS

McKINNON CREEK PUMPHOUSE PROJECT PHASE I

We are nearing completion for the first phase of this project, which consists of underground supply infrastructure - piping and utilities.

Phase II will complete the project with a new facility building that allows for a consolidation of control functions, water quality monitoring, and increased instrumentation. This project results in a major upgrade for the primary wellfield and distribution hub for the water district that will serve us well into the future.

WATER PROTECTOR AWARD

Customers of Lake Forest Park Water District enjoy untreated well water because we pump from an aquifer that has consistently produced an adequate supply of quality water. L60 CULVERT REPLACEMENT PROJECT

The City of Lake Forest Park is replacing deficient stream culverts as part of a program to accomodate fish habitat. The L60 culvert project is located where Lyon Creek crosses 178th just east of 44th. This project impacts a number of utilities including our water district which has had a 6" main running through the project corridor.

We appreciate collaborating with the City and their contractors on this project to coordinate the replacement of our affected water main with 100ft of upgraded 10" HDPE line.

Are You Ready For WINTER?



PREPARE FOR WINTER NOW - NO FROZEN PIPES!

Now is the time to cover and insulate outdoor spigots, put your hoses away when no longer needed. During freezing weather, any frozen pipes should be thawed slowly and carefully while monitoring for any leaks that may have devoloped.

- Outdoor hose bibs are susceptible to freezing, use an insulator.
- Know where your water shut-off valve is located
- Don't leave garden hose attached to the faucet in freezing weather
- Winterize your sprinkler system. Make sure your shutoff valve is off and irrigation lines are drained to prevent damage from freezing water.
- If you are vacationing during the winter, consider shutting off your supply to avoid potential flooding.



WATER CONSERVATION

The District encourages planting of **native species**. These plants require less water and reduce garden chemicals as they are acclimated to grow in the local environment. Now is time to plant native species. (We still have potted native species at the District office as part of our Plant Exchange Program). Plants have a much easier time acclimating this time of year and let nature do the watering!



For those that vacation especially during the winter months, leaks that develop inside or outside the house can remain unnoticed until there is



a large water bill or a flooded basement. There are a number of useful products on the market to alert you in case a leak develops, while also helping you keep an eye on your water usage.

Some products are made to sit on the floor behind the toilet for example and detect water leaks, others strap to your meter and give instant awareness of water flow, while still others require plumbing into your system but give you additional advantages like automatically shutting your water off when a leak is detected.
